## **ХОД УРОКА**

### **I. Организационный этап:**

1. Приветствие преподавателя со студентами. Проверка явки обучающихся.

2. Объявление даты, темы и задач урока. Today is the ... of November. The topic of our lesson today is: «Setting the table. The ABC of Table manners». The topic of our lesson is connected with your future profession. You can use new words and expressions of today's lesson in your future profession. The task of our lesson is to learn new words, rules of setting the table, the ABC of table manners. We shall ask and answer the questions, listen to the dialogue, make up dialogues, revise the grammar structure "to be going to do something" and do grammar exercises. You have the examine cards on your desks, which is necessary to fill the columns with the marks for each stage of the lesson. We shall sum up all your marks at the end of the lesson.

### **Основной этап:**

There are many proverbs about meals. Here are some of them. Look at the screen, read and find the Russian equivalents.

1. Live not to eat, but eat to live. – Живи не для того чтобы есть, а для того чтобы жить.

#### **3) Повторение лексики по теме "Table setting":**

Choosing a meal can be a problem sometimes because dishes are called unknown foreign names. Do not guess, ask the waiter to help you. Don't let the number of knives, forks and spoons confuse you. It is simple enough- use them in the order in which they are laid. I think that it is very important to know how to set the table. Look at the screen and name the place settings on the table.

Napkin – салфетка

#### 5) Объяснение грамматического материала.

To make up sentences in your dialogues we have to learn the grammar structure “To be going to do something”. Do you know this phrase? What does it mean? What is it used for?

Устойчивое выражение to be going to do something- собираться что-нибудь сделать.

##### To be going + Infinitive

Выражает: 1) Намерение- What are you going to do tomorrow?- Что ты собираешься делать завтра. I am going to meet my friends. Я собираюсь встретиться с друзьями.

2) То, что непременно или неизбежно произойдет- It is going to rain. – Будет дождь. We are going to be late. Мы опоздаем.

3) Отнесенность действия или факта к будущему- They are going to have a party on Sunday. Они устраивают вечеринку в субботу. She is going to wear her new dress. Она наденет новое платье.

#### 6) Работа с текстом «The ABC of Table manners».

Imagine that you are going to the restaurant with your friends. So it is very important to know «The ABC of Table manners». What table manners do you know? Do you follow them? Let's read and translate the article, then we shall discuss the main points of it. Look at the screen.

1. Do not attract undue attention to yourself in public.
2. When eating take as much as you want, but eat as much as you take.
3. Do not eat too fast or too slowly, cut as you eat.
4. Take a little of every dish that is offered to you.

5. Sit up straight and face the table, do not put your elbows on the table while eating.

6. Do not reach across the table – simply say “Would you please pass the salt,” etc.

7. At a small party do not start eating until all are served. At a large party it is not necessary to wait for all. The hostess gives a signal to her guests by saying: “Start eating, please (your food will get cold).”

8. There is no rule about eating every thing on your plate, to indicate that you have enough place knife and fork together, not criss-cross.

9. When refusing a dish simply say: “No, thank you,” when accepting, – “Yes, please.”

10. Do not leave the spoon in your cup when drinking tea or coffee.

11. Do not empty your glass quickly – it will be promptly refilled and you will find that you have drunk more than you intended.

(In continental way of eating you keep the knife in your right hand all the time during the dinner, and in American style you put your put your knife on the plate, and take the fork into your right hand, and if it is necessary to cut something you will take the knife again into your right hand. So it is very easy. )

- When refusing a dish simply say: "No, thank you," when accepting, – "Yes, please."
